# Walk With Scripture - Scripture Lesson

Title: Accountability in Brotherhood Walking Together in Faith

## **Focus Scripture:**

- **ESV:** James 5:16 "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working."
- NIV: James 5:16 "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

## **Lesson Outline:**

# **Opening Prayer (5 minutes):**

Heavenly Father,

We come before You today with open hearts, seeking Your guidance and wisdom as we study Your Word. Help us to embrace accountability with one another in love and humility. Strengthen our bonds as brothers in Christ, and allow this time together to deepen our commitment to walking faithfully before You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

## Introduction to the Topic (5-10 minutes):

Accountability is an essential part of our Christian walk, particularly within the context of brotherhood. When we are open and honest with one another about our struggles, we invite healing, growth, and the strengthening of our faith. James 5:16 calls us to confess our sins to one another and to pray for one another so that we may be healed. This lesson will explore the importance of accountability, confession, and prayer in building stronger relationships with God and each other.

# Bible Verses for Discussion (20 minutes):

## 1. Proverbs 27:5-6

- ESV: "Better is open rebuke than hidden love. Faithful are the wounds of a friend; profuse are the kisses of an enemy."
- NIV: "Better is open rebuke than hidden love. Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses."

#### 2. **Galatians 6:1-2**

- ESV: "Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."
- NIV: "Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore
  that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. Carry each other's burdens,
  and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."

## 3. Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

- ESV: "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up!"
- o **NIV:** "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up."

#### 4. 1 Thessalonians 5:11

- ESV: "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."
- NIV: "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing."

## Discussion Questions (15-20 minutes):

- 1. Why do you think God places such a strong emphasis on confessing our sins to one another? How does this practice promote healing and spiritual growth?
- 2. Reflecting on Galatians 6:1-2, how can we gently restore a brother who is struggling with sin? What role does humility play in being both accountable and holding others accountable?
- 3. Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 highlights the importance of having someone to lift us up when we fall. Can you share an experience where accountability with a brother helped you overcome a challenge or sin?

# Life Application (10 minutes):

Accountability is a gift that allows us to be honest about our weaknesses and encourages us to grow stronger in our faith. We need brothers in Christ who can speak truth into our lives, pray for us, and hold us accountable in love. This week, take the time to identify a fellow believer with whom you can share your struggles and pray regularly. Be intentional about fostering a relationship of mutual accountability and support, helping one another to stay on the path of righteousness.

## Reflection and Encouragement (5-10 minutes):

Think about the areas of your life where you need accountability. Are there struggles or temptations that you have been keeping to yourself? God has placed brothers in your life to help you bear these burdens. As you reflect on today's lesson, consider how embracing accountability can lead to freedom and growth in Christ. Don't be afraid to reach out for help and support—this is how we grow stronger together.

## **Closing Verse:**

• **ESV:** Colossians 3:16 – "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God."

• NIV: Colossians 3:16 – "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts."

## **Closing Prayer (5 minutes):**

Lord Jesus,

Thank You for reminding us of the importance of accountability and brotherhood. We ask for the courage to be honest about our struggles and to seek out trusted brothers who will walk alongside us. Help us to be faithful in praying for one another and encouraging each other in our spiritual journeys. May we grow closer to You and to each other as we walk in faith together. In Your mighty name, Amen.

# Takeaway Challenge:

This week, challenge yourself to open up to a fellow believer about a struggle or temptation you are facing. Pray together and commit to holding each other accountable, checking in regularly to offer support, encouragement, and prayer.
